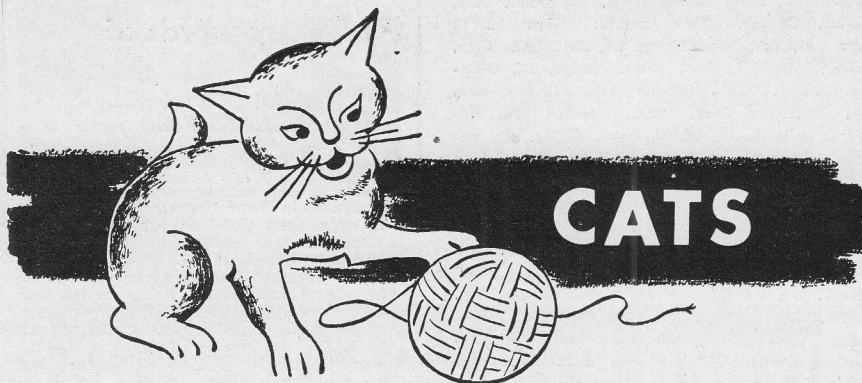

New Device Makes Cat Anesthesia Safer

Many objections of other methods overcome

One of the problems posed by surgery on cats, anesthesia, is reported to have been overcome with the development of a new anesthetic apparatus, the Trimar Inhaler.

The equipment was designed and produced by the Ohio Chemical and Surgical Equipment Co., a division

of Air Reduction Co., Inc., Madison, Wis., and a newcomer to the veterinary equipment field. Ohio Chemical has been making anesthetic gases and operating room equipment for human surgery for almost a half century.

Used with the anesthetic gas Trimar, Ohio Chemical's brand of trich-

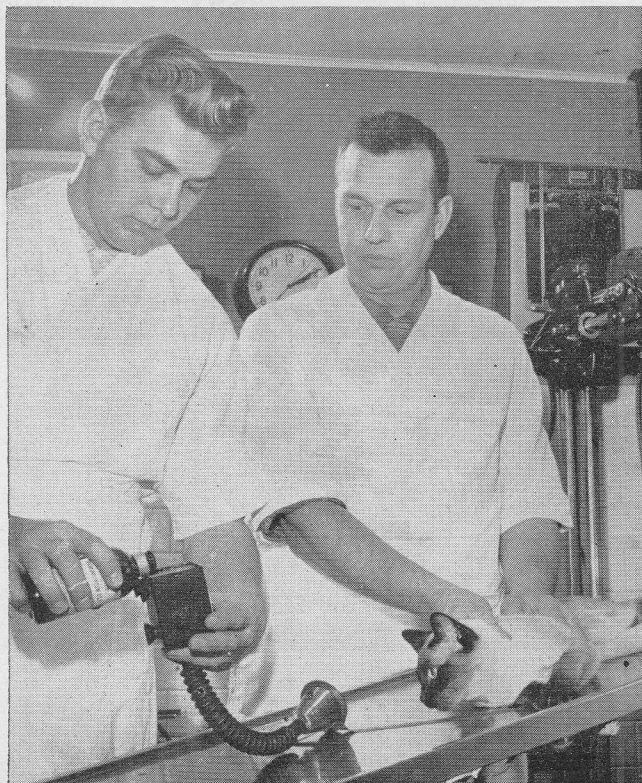
loroethylene USP, the Trimar Inhaler offers many advantages over the "cone" mask method used to administer ether, according to company officials. The cat inhales the gas through one valve and exhales through another, thus giving the operator complete control over the air and gas mixture at all times. Unlike ether, Trimar is pleasant smelling, non-explosive and non inflammable.

Dr. Paul T. Candlin, Madison veterinarian and small animal practitioner, used the new method to anesthetize more than 100 cats for surgery in his own hospital without losing a single cat.

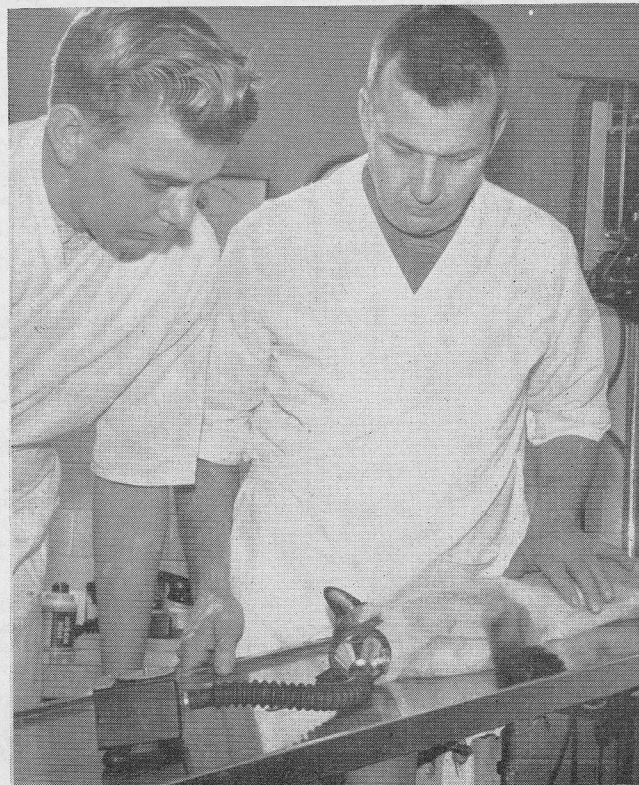
He reported that "Anesthesia in the cat has always been troublesome. The administration of the barbiturates had the disadvantage that some cats were hard to give intravenous injections. Some cats would stay asleep too long, chilling would occur and the patient would have to be kept in the hospital longer than necessary.

"Trimar has little odor. Most surgery can be done under the state of analgesia that is produced. The cats are recovered within 15 minutes from the time of administration of the gas. The cat does not have time to go into shock . . . Animals are sent home the same day, cutting down on overhead and the possibility of contracting disease."

Evolution of Breeds

An introduction to and review of
feline genetics by the
English authority

There is in all of us at some time or other, an urge for something new. This applies in all walks of life, and perhaps particularly so where the cultivation of livestock is concerned. It is natural that we should wish to try an idea which is fresh to us, even though we may know that others have done the same thing before. These ideas fascinate, and a sense of wonderment urges us on.

The desire to know how things come about, how they operate, and how improvements can be made, is common to us all. The desire to experiment is not only present in beginners, it stimulates old hands alike. The novice does not want to revolutionize. He is justified in his own outlook, and then, when he has achieved, he will be the more anxious to follow up by known and accepted methods.

The wish for experiment by the more advanced breeder is a little different. He has, by his experience and the gathered experience of others, gained a knowledge which enables him to apply in a more definite manner. Putting one's ideas into action is by no means a fault in itself, but it is unfair to pass on to others at random the results of practice unless it is known for sure there will be no upsetting factor through so doing. During the last half century or so, the science of heredity has been widely studied, and by acquainting himself with the main principles involved, the fancier is able to add much of certainty and of pleasure which he would otherwise miss. In this series it is hoped to deal with some relative matters.

The cat, we may assume, is polyphyletic in origin, that is to say it was evolved from several forms. Although there would be skeletal differences between the forms, thus giving variation of general body type, the main differences would be in coat pattern. It is probable that "pattern" gives more important clues to ancestry of the domestic cat than does coat-color, length of hair, stunting of tail or other such characters.

The pattern of coat seems originally to have fallen into two groups—"blotched," and "striped." A variation of the "striped" pattern was termed "lined" and was seen in the so-called Abyssinian breed, probably directly exported from Abyssinia. So far as the fancy is concerned, we can say that all the standardized breeds have been evolved from one general pattern which we have come to know as "tabby." This term embraces the patterns "lined," "striped" and "blotched." The character of the banding is only recognized easily in the presence of ticking. In the black or non-agouti series, banding exists as ghost-patterns recognizable usually, but not always, in the fur of kittens, and only occasionally distinguishable in adult cats. Ticking is characterized by "yellow" bands in the hairs; the ticking increases with age, so that kittens are relatively less ticked than cats.

All existing color or color-marked breeds and varieties emanated in two different ways: one, by spontaneous

mutation either in the wild or in captivity; or by interbreeding in the wild, or more directly through selective matings arranged and dictated by man. In the wild, the establishment of breeds or varieties of any animal must, of necessity, be a slow precarious process. In this state, mutations seldom meet their like, the nature of their difference is sometimes a handicap, and if they reach new territory, the new environment, including climate and food available, may be unsuitable. So in all, the new individual has the dice much loaded against its reproduction, or even its survival.

Furthermore, we know that natural enemies of any particular species take a terrible toll of life, which in many instances has its advantages as well as disadvantages! For instance, a pair of flies can produce 20,000 larvae. In two weeks these turn into flies and breed again. If all survived they would give rise to 100,000,000 more larvae. But flies do not increase to that extent in ultimate population. It has been estimated that on an average only two offspring of a pair of parents can survive to replace their parents when the latter die. So we may see what the hazards are against the survival of mutations, new breeds and varieties, in the wild.

On the other hand, mutations which may occur in a fancy are quickly noted and shielded, their reproduction is aided by selected pairings, and they are given the most suitable of all that goes to form satisfactory environment. But man cannot create—he can only manipulate with whatever material is available.

When it has been decided to adopt some particular species for fancy use, with perhaps color variations as a main object, one has to wait for nature to "slip-up" and produce some initial mutation. Then, by a series of back-crossing, other variations may be produced. When the original species contains more than one basic color in its make-up, it is usual that the back-crossing of the initial mutation will only be able to give a limited range of fresh color variations. In these cases, it becomes necessary for some further mutation (or mutations) to occur before the complete possible range of color variations can become producible.

Although the range of color variation in cats was already extensive, fresh additions continue to be made from time to time. These are mostly through selective breeding by fanciers who have been able to predict results by their knowledge of inheritance, thus making production of the required and straightforward in process.

Apart from selection, an occasional useful mutation in cats still occurs, the latest example being that of the rex gene giving the curly coat character. An original mutant of this nature was identified in Cornwall England by me about seven years ago, and breeding stock is now being used in both England and America. Similar mutations have also occurred in both America and Germany. The American stock was lost, and the German mutant did not reproduce.

The Story Behind Golden Boy

Fate seemed to have
something against
this kitten

Looking back now at the twisted, ragged chain of events which produced Dbl. Gr. Ch. Rosemont Golden Boy, it seems as though a kitten which could hurdle the obstacles fate placed in his path, could not help becoming the highest scoring cat in the country today. Golden Boy has capped an outstanding show career by becoming the first "Inter-American Royal Merit Cat, and highest scoring cat of the year for 1956 with a record of 39 Best Cat wins to his credit.

Golden Boy's story really dates back to a cold and blistery December day some years ago when a breeder telephoned to say that she would give me a cream kitten if I would come and get it. Unbeknown to my husband who objected, "We have too many cats now, let her keep it," my daughter and I drove on icy streets across Detroit to the breeder's home. Our hearts went out to the darling, little cream girl, so thin and dirty, that we saw there. Needless to say, we brought her home with us, not daring to show her to my husband until we had bathed her. When we finally did show her to him, he scowled and growled, "Another cat!" We named the mite Cherie (Lee's Hi-Hat Cherie of Rosemont) and she thrived at Rosemont, going to Best Cat in many shows and earning her grand championship.

The second important link in the chain of events which eventually produced Golden Boy was the arrival at Rosemont of King Pin (officially now Dbl. Gr. Ch. Rosegate's King Pin of Rosemont), a strapping giant of a cream boy. Friend husband commented, "Looks to me like you got too much cat for your money. We have large cats, but this cat is ridiculous. Send him back. Who's going to tote this lug around?" King Pin seemed to know that my husband wanted to get rid of him, so he turned on the charm, and they quickly became true pals.

When Cherie reached the breeding

age, feeling that King Pin was far too large to be a suitable mate for her, we tried every other male at Rosemont, but without success. As a last resort, we placed her with King Pin—success at last.

Nine weeks passed and still Cherie gave no indication of getting down to the business of delivering a family. Finally in desperation, we took her to a veterinarian. It was the 72nd day. He tried to induce labor with injections, but when these failed he performed a Caesarian with "yours truly" standing by to take care of what I hoped would be a nice large litter of kittens. The veterinarian shattered this illusion when he muttered, "I think that she has only one kitten and it looks like it is dead." He then handed me the largest kitten that I had ever seen at birth, and I started administering artificial respiration. I kept it up, for I don't know how long, until my efforts were rewarded with a lusty cry. Seconds later it was followed by a feeble "mew," emitted by the smallest kitten I have ever seen. The veterinarian didn't want me to take the tiny kitten home, saying that it couldn't live and that I would just feel badly when it failed to nurse. Being me and being stubborn, I bundled up Cherie, her oversized male and her undersized female, and took off for home. Infection set in and for three days Cherie was too ill to care for her precious babies, so I acted as wet nurse, using cotton to massage their little bottoms. But Cherie, sweet cherub that she is, did nurse her family, even as badly as she felt. Soon she was taking over completely, seeming to know what a treasure she had.

The oversized cream male was Golden Boy and from the start, there was no holding him back. At six months, he surpassed his mother in size, and now at five years, he is as huge as his well-known father.

As you may suspect, two big cats around the place were too much for friend husband who soon raised the fearfully-anticipated question, "When are you selling that cream male? We have enough males." And worse luck, along came a lady to purchase Golden Boy. A year passed and Golden Boy came back to Rosemont while the lady enjoyed a vacation. When she returned, she informed me that her neighbors didn't appreciate the music Golden Boy had been making—his tomcat call was terrific. Needless to say, we quickly came to terms and Golden Boy returned to Rosemont permanently.

The Parade of Royalty featured herein represents a first and is the sum of several firsts in the Cat Fancy. The Inter-American Merit Sweepstakes Awards announced here mark the first time that a cat organization has given this type of awards for the outstanding cats of a show season. These awards, sponsored by the American Cat Fanciers Association, are based upon a system of merit ratings, based in turn upon official scores with Merit Certificates being offered in grades of "Merit," "High Merit," and "Royal Merit." To earn the "Merit" rating a cat must receive five or more scores of 85 or more points; for "High Merit" rating, 90 or more; and for "Royal Merit" 95 or more.

To be eligible for consideration for Inter-American or Regional awards, a cat must have been officially scored 85 or more points by at least five different judges in ACFA shows, with an average score for the season in excess of 85 points. Every official score received during the season was considered. Awards were based on this system so that the Best Cat is the highest scoring cat for the year, etc. Inter-American recognition was given to 73 cats; 107 received regional awards.

came to make his home with me (they took in a stray kitten). He is an altered cat, about four-years-old, and has a heavy coat and had a lovely tail. Last summer when he shed, his tail got very thin and stringy. In the fall, when he got his winter coat, it filled in at the top and end, but there is a thin space in the middle. During the last few weeks the tail has become very thin again. He seems well and eats heartily. I vary his diet. At his home, where he drops in for an occasional snack, they give him tinned salmon. What do you think might be the cause of this trouble and what remedy would you suggest? It detracts greatly from his appearance aside from causing him a great deal of annoyance.

A. Keep your cat on a completely fresh food diet, avoiding cooked foods entirely for the time being. Be certain he gets something green, such as oat sprouts, asparagus, or spinach, a little cod liver oil and tomato or orange juice. Permit out of doors as often as possible.
