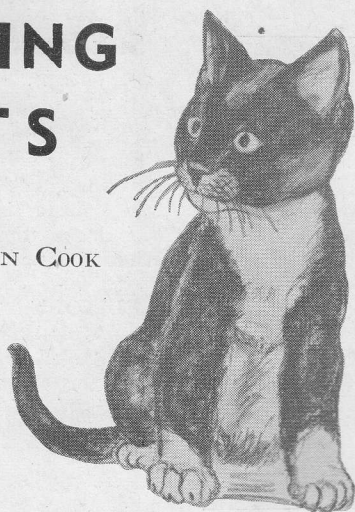

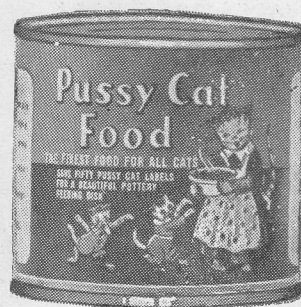

Figures off Beam

After reading the letter from H. B. Zieses, of Detroit, descriptive of the activities of an organization in San Francisco calling itself "Pets Unlimited," which appeared in CATS (April, 1948) I think it only fair to correct the erroneous impression created by the misinformation contained therein.

The figures employed must have been literally picked out of thin air, since they have no relation to anything tangible. I have never heard of a single animal shelter or pound anywhere which could possibly house "an accumulation of 2,240 dogs and 1,616 cats" at one time. Certainly the San Francisco Public Pound Department has never had such an "accumulation."

Further, animals are auctioned only when more than one person wants the same animal, as a means of determining which person shall have the animal mutually desired.

The whole tone of the letter implying a heartless city pound in San Francisco is not only misleading, but is an undeserved aspersion upon the fourth oldest anti-cruelty society in the country. The San Francisco Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals has operated the pound for the City and County of San Francisco since 1890 in a manner which has exemplified kind treatment and humane care, and the Society's animal shelter is constantly being referred to as a model for other communities.

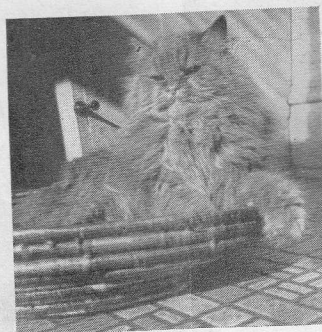

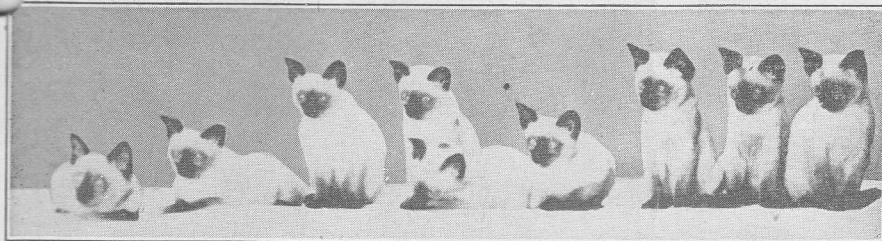

CAT OR DOG?

Which is smarter, a dog or a cat? This is a question that will always be asked and will never be settled. Quite naturally, dog owners adhere to the dog, while cat lovers will uphold the cat. Those with both dogs and cats will only smile at the question, knowing full well that it is something that cannot be answered.

In April, *The Philadelphia Bulletin* conducted a popularity poll among its readers to determine which pet is preferred. The question asked was: "Which Makes a Better Pet—Cat or Dog?"

The results showed that 50.1% voted for dogs; 44.1% voted for cats; 4.0% stated "both"; .5% indicated no pets, while others 1.3% as is the usual case decided canaries, guppies, gnu, skunk, kangaroo, wild birds, monkey, husband and women.

"The consensus," according to the *Bulletin's* poll editor, "seems to be that dogs are ideal where there is room for them to run, cats are ideal where the pet must spend most of the time indoors, especially in small apartments."

According to our viewpoint on the matter, as far as the poll's percentages are concerned, it shows that 50.1% own dogs; 44.1% who voted own cats; 4.0% who replied "both," own dogs and cats; and the remaining 1.3% are the usual group found in every survey who believes it is the correct thing to reply with the customary foolishness.

Recently, a reader was interviewed on a radio broadcast and asked the question, which is smarter—dog or cat? She was a little taken back by the question, not having been prepared for it.

We believe that Mr. James Mason the eminent English motion picture star and actor, in his interview on the popular radio program, "We, The People," several months ago has given the very best reply:

"Actually they (cats) are extremely intellectual. I read of an experiment once. A cat and a dog were placed in a small room, with gas coming in through a little hole in the floor. The dog just ran around and consequently used up all his breath and died. But the cat calmly sniffed around until he found the hole the gas was coming from. Then he walked over and sat on it!"

Here is an inflation note from Ada, Ohio. According to the Associated Press, an express bill arrived for Lee Morrison along with a crate, whereon was listed, "One Cat." He opened the box to find a cat and six kittens. The express company had added an extra charge, too—12 cents for milk at Cincinnati enroute.

Mother Bee, writing in *The Rural New Yorker* imparts this thought, "Whenever I am asked about domestic cats and

their ways with birds, I recall 60 years of cats and do admit that once in a great while there appears an outlaw cat which watches and waits to catch a bird at any opportunity. These outlaws, however (almost always large males), are not the ordinary farm cats I have met. These spend their main time under the barn, along the fences, persistently hunting small rodents rather than birds."

This is the time of year when cats (and dogs) need special summer care. Don't forget that hot weather makes pets, just like human beings, irritable. Don't clip the fur of the cat to make it cool. You are only upsetting a natural protection for the cat against the heat.

CATS BROADCAST AT MILWAUKEE

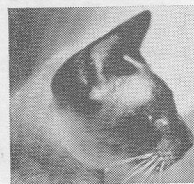

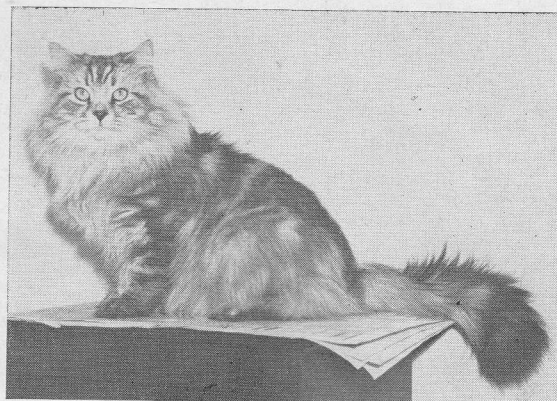

"MY CAT IS AN ALL-AMERICAN"

Owner Tells of Suspense Waiting for Possible News That Ch. Merza's Me-Lad of Mi-Choice Captures National Title

When Champion Merza's Me-Lad of Mi-Choice received the award of 1947 All-American Cat it gave me the biggest thrill during my very short "career" with pedigree show stock.

You see, I had only been interested in the exhibition of my silver tabbies for a year, and the news of this extraordinary victory climaxed all the pleasant and exciting experiences of my first year of showing cats.

I knew from the first time I exhibited Me-Lad that he was a fine and sturdy animal, because of opinions expressed by my breeder friends who looked him over carefully at the shows. The instant success I had with him at the exhibitions proved this point beyond a shadow of a doubt. However, I learned he was the best in the very large mid-west area when I received notice at the close of the season that he was selected as the All-Midwestern Silver Tabby Male, while his daughter, Hon-Nie Lou of Mi-Choice was the 1947 All-Midwestern Silver Tabby Female.

Both my husband and myself were truly thrilled.

In May, the pictures of our two Midwestern Silver Tabby winners appeared in CATS MAGAZINE. We quickly looked in the April issue to see the All-Eastern selections of this breed to compare by photos our winners with those of the East. We were disappointed not to find the East's top Silver Tabbies pictured. You see, we were getting ideas. The question was: What chances did Me-Lad and Hon-Nie Lou have to win the grand national award of All-American Silver Tabby?

The June issue arrived and we fumbled through the pages to see the best Silver Tabbies of the South. Again we were disappointed! No photographs were shown! Once again we were in the dark. *If we could only see the best in the East and South, then we would know if our cats stood a chance!*

One more month rolled by, and then on a hot summer day, the July issue arrived with the All-Western selections. No pictures! Were we disappointed?

The suspense was terrible. Here we were waiting and hoping with nothing to go on except names of winners in other

sections of the country. Of course we checked over the show reports for a clue or two, but since these are incomplete and do not contain class winners, they were absolutely of no help.

It was a very, very long month of August. We received no other information. We had just about given up. Several of our friends wrote to tell us their cats had been selected All-American. We were convinced that Me-Lad and Hon-Nie Lou had lost out. "Oh well," we told each other, "Next year is another year and we'll try again. Some other cats have won and that's that!"

Then came that AA notice. There was a letter of apology from the Editor. The notice had been sent two weeks ago to "Lawrenceville, Indiana" instead of "Illinois." The Editor must be a native of Indiana or something, because he had listed our address in the All-Midwestern lineup as Lawrenceville, Indiana. Me-Lad was the 1947 All-American Silver Tabby! What a thrill!

A few days later, we received telephone calls from each of the newspapers in Lawrenceville. They had received the news of the selection of Me-Lad. Congratulations and all that! Is he a big cat? Is he a pretty cat? Are you going to sell him? What does he eat? We were asked all kinds of questions. The stories appeared in the newspapers and several neighboring city newspapers also carried the account of our first All-American win!

The fact that we had the only winning cat in the State of Illinois certainly created a stir in our hometown and the surrounding locality. The local newspaper stories brought the interested folks right to our door. We received telephone calls and letters. The out-of-towners descended over the weekend. There had been newswire dispatches in their hometown papers both from Lawrenceville and Utica, New York. People called to see our cats and especially the "famous All-American male."

Unfortunately, we could not "cash in" on this State-wide publicity by selling kittens. You see, we were only beginners, blessed with two lovely cats. We didn't have a single kitten to sell.

We still have a long list of prospects

DON'T WORRY IF MOTHER CAT CANNOT NURSE KITS

By Rita Swenson

One of the most upsetting experiences confronting new breeders is to find that their valuable little queen, acquired and bred at no small cost, is unable to nurse her new born kittens due to a lack of milk. This problem, faced at some time or other by all breeders, need not prove alarming and need result in no loss of kittens provided one knows what to do to meet this emergency.

Actually, many queens do not have a milk supply immediately after kitting, the milk secretions being delayed for as long as several hours in some instances. At this point in the life of the new born kitten there is no urgent need for mother's milk, though one always prefers to know it is present. The kittens will not starve to death even though forced to go without nourishment for a number of hours. In cases of delayed lactation, frequently a tiny amount of nourishment can be acquired by the kittens and though not

enough to satisfy their appetites, will satisfy them temporarily and keep them quiet. Too, the nursing of the kittens has a good effect on the mother cat for this tends to stimulate and hasten the flow of milk. By the second day, the mother cat should have a fairly good supply of milk, the amount increasing until it reaches its normal flow.

In instances where the mother cat does NOT have a fair supply of milk on the second day, one should look for causes. If the bowels have not moved, a good dose of mineral oil is in order. If the cat is feverish or ill, she should receive prompt veterinary attention. Next, the diet should be enriched. The mother cat should be given plenty of rich milk, either plain or beaten up with egg, and her solid food should consist of good fresh raw beef

fortified with a little cod liver oil. An extra nourishing diet is usually the cure for a stubborn milk supply, and especially if the cat is at all run down.

Conditions resulting in a complete and permanent lack of milk are fortunately rare. However, it does happen on occasion and unless one is able to cope with the situation, he stands to lose the entire litter. When a mother cat cannot care for her own babies, a foster mother cat is the answer. By making inquiries in the neighborhood in which one lives, one can generally locate someone that owns a mother cat with kittens, that will oblige. In acquiring a foster mother cat, it is preferable to select a cat (if there is a choice) whose own kittens are about the same age as that of the orphan babies. This will insure an even distribution of food.

In transferring kittens to a foster mother, one should smear all the kittens, orphans

PERTINENT FACTS CONCERNING SECTIONAL AND A-A RANKING

The rankings of the above listed All-Southern cats have been determined primarily by the number of cats each has defeated in his or her own color, breed and sex classifications, plus additional point credits accumulated as a result of major awards won by individual cats at shows. These include Best, Best Champion, Best Novice, Best Shorthair etc., and their opposite counterpart. The

number of CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS AWARDED by the association that sanctions the show DO NOT COUNT, NOR ARE THEY TABULATED in the individual point scoring of the cats. The foregoing applies to the All-Southern rankings as well as all previously published sectional rankings.

Points for ranking are tabulated only during one show season.

Rankings are given to classifications only when three or more associations recognize that classification in their standards (i.e., only CFF recognizes odd-eye whites).

Rankings are not given cats in domestic shorthair division and manx division other than solids or tabbies. Part-colored are not included in the rankings.

FLORIDA CAPTURES 18 ALL-SOUTHERN AWARDS

BLUE PAIR TOPS LINEUP, REPRESENTING 9 STATES

Forty-eight show cats, three more than last year, are the cream of the South, according to the release of the 1948 All-Southern rankings.

The listing shows twenty-eight in the Long Hair (Persian) Division, eight in the Domestic Short Hair Division, seven in the Foreign Short Hair Division, and five in the Manx (Short Hair) Division.

Nine states are represented in the All-Southern sweepstakes, with Mississippi and North Carolina crashing into the "select circle" for the first time. Florida leads the way with 18 winners, followed by Georgia with 10, Louisiana with 7, Virginia with 5, Tennessee with 3, Washington, D. C. with 2, and Texas, North Carolina and Mississippi with one each.

Topping the list of winners is Miss Winifred Porter of New Orleans with six rankings followed by Mrs. Florence Kemmer with five. The Louisiana breeder scored with three wins in each the Manx and the Foreign Short Hair Divisions. Mrs. Kemmer captured five places in the Persian set, although one of her wins is scored as lessee of the red male, Duncan-hires Courageous, owned by a Midwestern (Ohio) resident.

A technical difficulty arose concerning placement of the "leased" cat, since its

official owner is a resident of another section. However, it was decided that because the Ohio cat was under the show rights of the Florida breeder and competed and scored all his 1947-48 points in southern exhibitions, that the animal should be tendered All-Southern rating. This is the first instance where such a situation prevailed.

This decision brings up another technicality wherein Mrs. Kimmer exhibited a cat exclusively in the East with agents handling the entry. Since this Southern-owned cat was not listed in show catalogs as being leased, it was rated as an All-Southern representative despite the fact that it scored heavily in the East. In comparison between the two decisions it was ruled that a cat under the rights of a lessee is permitted to exhibit the cat as the lessee sees fit and not the owner, while in the other instance, the owner determines in what shows a cat is to be exhibited and passes these instructions direct to the agent.

Top ranking cat of the South for 1948 is the blue male, Grand Champion Dixi-Land's Pearl Harbor Yank, owned by Mrs. John H. Revington of Bristol, Tennessee. High point scoring opposite is the blue female, Champion Dixi-Land's Felice of Nor-Mont, owned by Mrs. Merald E.

Hoag of Arlington, Virginia. Both cats picked up the majority of their points in southern shows, but added to their totals by outstanding wins in other areas. This is the first instance wherein a male and female of the same color and breed classification have scored in any one section.

Ten cats that won All-Southern rankings last year have retained their laurels in 1948. Only one of the South's four All-Americans of 1947 repeated from last year, this being the blue-eyed white domestic short hair, Tyrol of Moonlight, owned by Miss Athalia Bunting of Indian Rocks, Fla.

Each All-Southern cat listed will receive a 1948 All-Southern ribbon award and a Certificate of Award in early fall, sent direct to the owner or lessee.

Australia Releases Circular To Cut Cat Population

The Animal Welfare League of Melbourne, Australia, is trying to raise the "living standard of cats." In a printed circular the League begs owners of female cats to assist in keeping the cat population down by—

"1. Having all female kittens painlessly destroyed within a few hours of birth, and never keeping more than one male kitten.

"2. Having the male kitten treated by a veterinary surgeon or at a clinic."

The circular continues: "If you do these things you will be helping to solve the stray cat problem but, until these methods are universally adopted, the number of strays will not be diminished. It is kinder

to do this than to rear females and give them away. Sooner or later they become a nuisance and are cast off to fend for themselves. It is the thoughtless, though kindly people who will not try to learn simple facts about cats who are responsible for the misery of thousands of homeless animals."

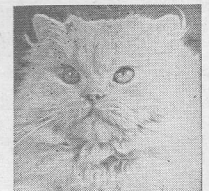

and the cat's own, with either butter or the oil from a tin of sardines. This will induce the mother cat to lick them and cats being the maternal creatures they are, will "brand" the orphan kittens as their own during the cleaning process.

If the litter of kittens that the foster mother is raising is unusually large, it goes without saying one should provide extra nourishment for the babies just as soon as one can teach them to lap. A litter of over four is a terrific drain on the mother cat when the kittens are four weeks of age and over. It is a kindness to ease her burden as much as possible.

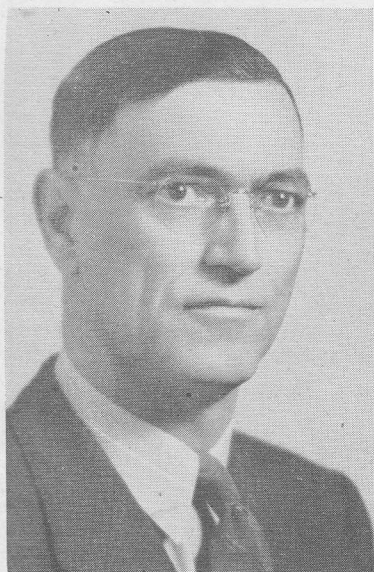

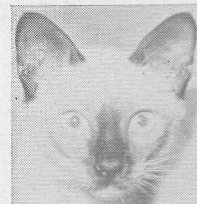

to us, and spurs us on in our efforts to develop a strain of Silver Tabbies second to none! We have pledged ourselves to work for more beautiful markings, better coats and better body type.

It is my firm belief that the ratings in the different sections and the All-American finals go a long way toward creating interest in cat shows and the development of better pure-bred strains. The ratings should encourage breeders to show their best instead of only a few in exhibitions. Good clean competition is good for any enterprise.

I personally believe the method of rating cats seems fair and unbiased, however, more space should be devoted to explaining how the winners are chosen.

My contacts with other breeders during the past show season, I found some who like the idea and others who are not convinced that such a rating amounts to any-

thing. Those doubters, I believe do not understand the procedure.

As for me, I am mighty proud of winning an All-American award. My certificates are mounted in my scrapbook that also contains the newspaper clippings about my cats at shows. The scrapbook is now getting quite large and bulky. My All-American rosette and my All-Midwestern ribbons are always prominently and proudly displayed in my cages at the shows I attend.

I worked this past season for another All-American win. Recently I received the thrill of a Midwest notice for Champion Hon-Nie Lou this year. Once again I am going through the suspense of waiting and comparing as time drags on for that All-American notice, should I be lucky to win. I know the competition is even greater this year. I know and understand full well it isn't easy. Should Hon-Nie

Lou come through, we will be as happy as when we won our first national award, and you can be sure we'll be working even harder next season for another "AA" for my Silver Tabbies.

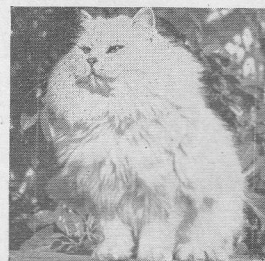

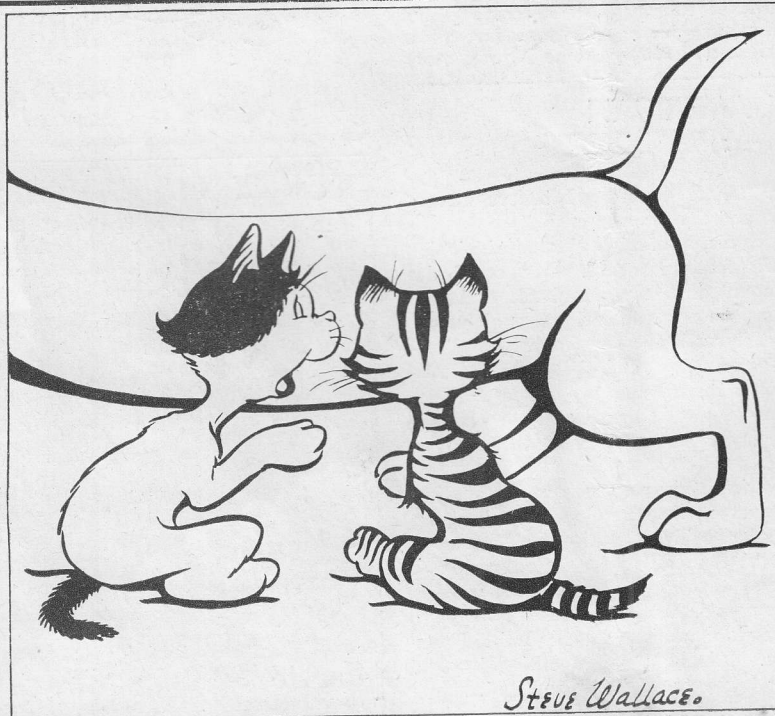

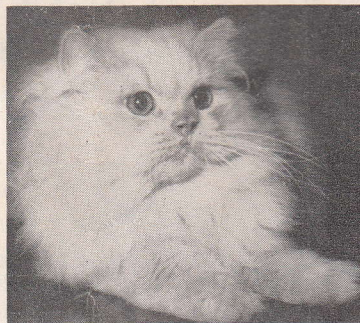
