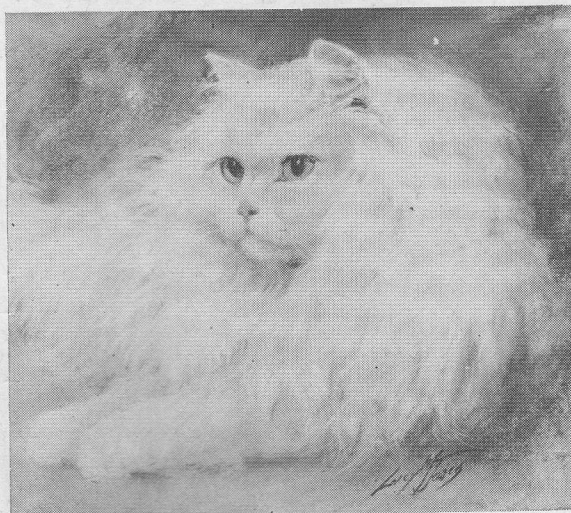

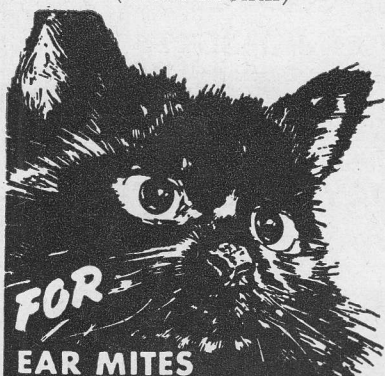
THE READERS ALWAYS WRITE

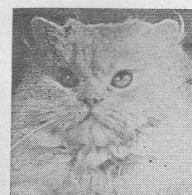

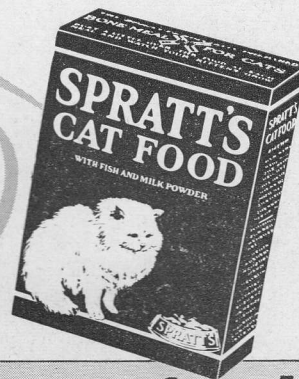

THE WHITE CAT

By FLORENCE KEMMER

(First of Two Parts)

STANDARD—Pure white, no colored hairs; eyes deep blue or orange. Type, low on legs, deep in chest, massive shoulders. Head, large with great breadth of skull, ears neat, round tipped and set wide apart, not unduly open at the base, eyes large, round, full, set wide apart, brilliant, giving a sweet expression to the face, nose short, snub, broad, cheeks full, jaw broad and powerful. Back level, tail short, full and carried without a curve at an angle lower than the back but not trailing when walking. Paws large, round, firm, toes carried close. Coat long and should show perfect physical condition.

White cats are dominant as to both color and type, and may have blue eyes, orange eyes or one blue and one orange eye. Eye color may vary as to shade since it is a quantitative trait that can be improved or moved one way or the other at the breeder's will. It has been observed that the blue eyes in the deaf White cat received as a mutation are very pale with a blue line around the pupils. When orange eyes have been received from Blue eye matings, the eye is yellow with a greenish tinge. Selective breeding can bring either of these eye colors up to a standard blue or orange.

The Whites are the only two varieties that require definite eye color to "make" their class. Those for the Blue Eye Whites mean cats with the sapphire blue eyes; those for the Orange Eye Whites must have orange eyes to enter their class. White cats, because of this, must be passed upon somewhat differently in judging. It is true that ten points are still allowed for eye color. Should the class call for Blue Eye White Male, Open, then the cats entered in this class *must* have blue eyes. Cats with gray or green eyes are not competition for the truly Blue Eye cat.

The novice should realize that color in White cats is as important as in all other varieties. Of course some will say, "White is white." If you refer to a color chart you will note various whites listed. Color of the White cat should be *pure white*, not ivory nor with a blue or gray tint.

Texture in coat is another important factor in White cats. Many have coats too harsh. This fault is often in evidence when there is a large class of White cats entered in an exhibition. Breeders can eliminate this fault, if, during the summer months they comb out the old coat of dead hair, giving ample opportunity for the new coat to grow in by fall. Since White cats usually do not show any discoloration or dead hair they are sometimes not as well groomed during the shedding season. Thus,

many often appear at the winter shows with dead hard coats that spoil the general texture. When the judge, going over a cat, has no infallible means of knowing which is dead coat or a naturally undesirable coarse coat, you are not giving your White cat an "even break," because you failed to remove the dead coat with daily grooming during the summer. If the old coat down the spine resists the comb, then pluck it out, and see how much finer the texture of coat will be when the next show season arrives.

In litters from a Blue and White cross, often one or more of the kits will be born with a blue spot on the head. This usually disappears when the marked kitten gets its permanent coat. In fact, I know of only four which retained the spot when full grown. One of these was so good otherwise that it took Winners in shows in the North despite this discoloration.

Some believe all Blue Eye White cats are deaf. This is not true. In my years of breeding, I have had only three deaf kittens, a Blue Eye, an Odd Eye, and the third with beautiful copper eyes. Neither do deaf cats necessarily have deaf kittens. According to a chart published in *All Pets* (May 1947), Mrs. William K. Hedrick shows that the ideal mating to procure a majority of sound hearing Blue Eye White kits is to use a deaf Blue Eye homozygous male with an Orange Eye hybrid for color.

Odd Eye White cats have been more or less "a social outcast" until recently. Then one association realizing their worth as breeders of Blue Eye Whites recognized them and gave them a classification. Some

FIFTY-TWO CATS WIN 1948 ALL-AMERICAN

Eight Retain Titles; Mrs. R. H. Hecht Lands Five

Fifty-two cats have earned the title of 1948 All American, according to the final chartings released by the All-America Cattery Board.

The titles are granted as a result of competition furnished each cat in the exhibitions held in the United States and Canada from August 1947, to and including March 1948, with a mathematical point system applied and additional point credits for major wins scored. Every show staged in America was rated.

The winning cats do not represent the personal choices of CATS nor the publishers.

The rankings reveal five more titles than last year, when forty-seven felines were named. Eight 1948 winners retain their All American titles in their respective breed, color and

sex, won in 1947, a remarkable achievement.

The Midwest carried off top honors with 15, followed by the East with 14; the West with 12; the South with 7; the Dominion of Canada with three; and the Northwest with one.

Mrs. R. H. Hecht of Normandy, Mo., topped the field with five entries.

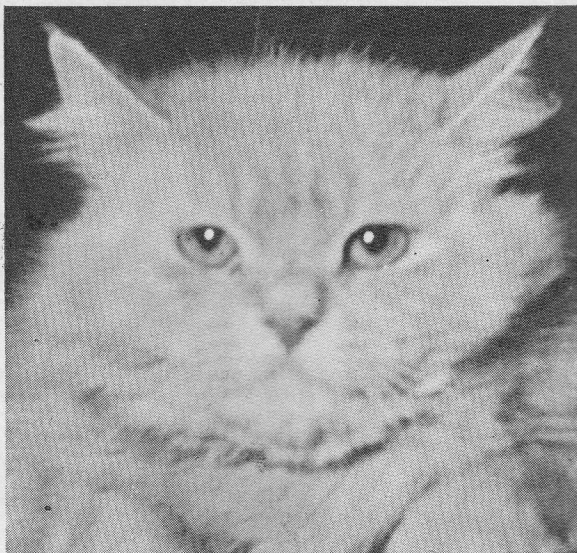

CAT TAILS...

Out in Cottonwood, Lyon County, Minnesota, lives Mrs. Edward Wallace who owns a Siamese named Fè Fo Figaro. Now according to Mrs. Wallace, Figaro is the cleverest little clown that ever happened. The two of them take long walks through the rural areas and Figaro keeps up a running conversation all the way. Should he meet anything on four feet, twice or three times his size, Figaro will sputter and fizz like a short circuit and his vocabulary is decidedly sulphuric. When they return home, as soon as they enter the front door, he undergoes a complete change

from the toughie-rustabout to a courteous little gentleman. No matter to him if the butcher DID leave fish on the kitchen table. There is no table-hopping for Figaro—not if Mrs. Wallace is looking, but should she leave the room, Figaro will carry on a raucously rabid monologue, arguing with himself about the merits of man-made laws and cat-made laws. Then with a majority vote of one—he polishes off the fish.

At the New York City Hall, all is sadness today, for Tammany, the grizzled, tiger-striped cat who has held his own against all enemies for the last eight years, succumbed yesterday morning to those two unbeatable adversaries, old age and severe illness. The old warrior went down with

Y. The Mayor and the reporters glad'y fell in with the idea. An inscription was placed over the little grave reading: "Tammany—In Fond Memory of Our Cat, Room 9, City Hall."

Room 9 is the reporters' room where Tammany spent most of his time. "Some say Tammany was just a cat," the Mayor lamented, "a clean limbed, two-fisted, hard-hitting cat to be sure, but after all only a cat. Do these superficial persons know the unspoken wisdom behind those redoubtable whiskers—? The cool estimate of humane nature screened behind the yellow luster of those unreadable eyes? Tammany was the guardian, the center, the sage of City Hall."

On the way to the hospital, he was quiet and trustful in the arms of his friends. There was just one little cry at the passing scenes of Lafayette street told of a journey far from home. Tammany seemed to know it was his last journey. "So now, the familiar upreaching of the head to be

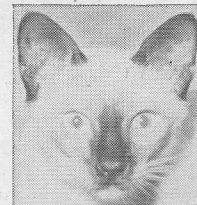

breeders of other colors who have not bred nor studied Whites have claimed this difference in eye color is a congenital defect. Those who have given the breeding of this color more study, realize it is the fault of the chromosomes.

Each chromosome is composed of genes arranged in linear order. Breaks in the pairs may result in the crossing over or interchange of parts between them. Since this causes mutations in color, why not eye color?

During the years, many crosses have been used to improve Whites. Mrs. Pearson, in an article published in 1927 wrote "I have never found a White cross of value in colors with which I am familiar. However, the amber-eyed Whites... having an orange cross back of them show a glorious advantage in eye color."

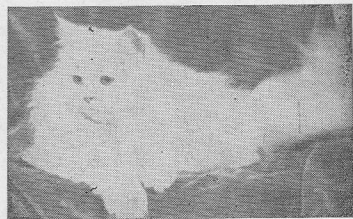

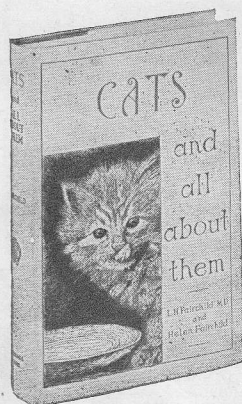

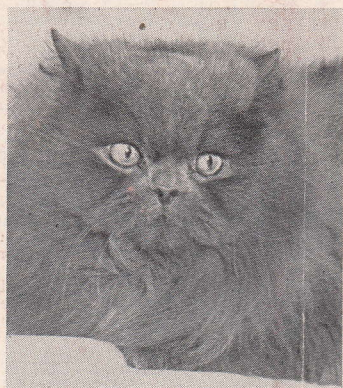
