## CAT OWNERS ACTIVE SENDING FOOD TO BRITAIN

For nearly a year, certain understanding and appreciative members of the American Cat Fancy have been carrying on plans to send packages of cat food and other feline supplies to needy exhibitors and breeders in England. The project is a sort of Feline C.A.R.E.

It is interesting to note that many American breeders and exhibitors hold a closeness for England in a feline way, because of the excellent stock that has been imported from there ever since the birth of the American Cat Fancy more than fifty years ago, and because so many of the outstanding English cats of the past are the progeny of our finest animals in America today. It is therefore a means of showing appreciation and interest by Americans for the English stock which has been so badly curtailed and depleted because of the ravages of the past war. The Fancy in England is very slowly recovering from the shock.

The idea for the Feline C.A.R.E. must be given Mrs. Cicely C. Mellor of Felinia fame, who, as early as last November a year ago outlined her plan to CATS, to be known as CAT CARTONS, UNLIMITED. Mrs. Mellor sold the idea to the officials of the Cat Fanciers Federation and

as a result, collections of canned horse meat and powdered milk products have been finding their way to England, and eventually to the dinner plates of England's undernourished pussies.

Mrs. Mellor has been working her plan through Mr. Sydney France, publisher of the English cat magazine, *Cats and Kittens*. According to Mr. France, the ration for cat stock in England is exceedingly small and the regular supply of horse meat is "practically nil!"

Not to be outdone by the C.F.F.-Mellor CAT CARTONS UNLIMITED, the Cat Fanciers Association have launched a similar project under the direction of Mr. J. B. Howlett. According to the October issue of the C.F.A. Bulletin, affiliated clubs have been responding unhesitatingly to the cause. These include The Golden Gate Club, Colorado Cat Fanciers, Cotton States Cat Club, Blue Cat Society of America, Norfolk Cat Club, Twin City Cat Fanciers, Empire Cat Club and the C.F.A. headquarters. Extracts from letters of thanks reprinted in the Bulletin prove how terrifically appreciative the English recipients are.

From Cleveland and the typewriter of Mr. Charles McGrew comes a formal letter outlining similar plans for still another Feline C.A.R.E. The project has been launched by the recently organized A.B.C. Club (All Breed Cat Club), an affiliate of the American Cat Association. We turn you over to Mr. McGrew who asks CATS to enlist the aid of putting the "ADOPT A CAT" program before the cat owners of America.

"The membership of this Club is packing small boxes of canned foods, canned supplements, vitamins, toys, etc., and is sending same to the hardest hit (English) breeders for their cats. The need is far too great for any one club, regardless of its size and bank account to cover adequately. We have several lists of names of the neediest breeders in England, who would be most appreciative of a gift box occasionally to help them feed their animals. We will be happy to furnish the names and addresses to those who desire to help us in our efforts.

"We would like to see each club in the U. S. and Canada adopt one

breeder and send that breeder a box of food as often as possible . . . this need is far greater than we in America can imagine. The English breeders have the same problems with their cats as we had here during the war, except that their rationing is still less than half what ours was at its lowest ebb. Consequently, their need is double that of our past lean years."

Thus you have the picture what the American Cat Fancier is doing today.

CATS believes these projects are magnificent and warrant the careful study and thought of each of its readers.

Since there are three separate groups conducting a single worthwhile and typical American job, we herewith present the names and addresses of the contacts of this threeway Feline C.A.R.E. Each group has the full endorsement of CATS. However we urge you to write only those named herewith.

# THE CHURCH CAT

FAMOUS FELINE HONORED THROUGHOUT WORLD FOR  
MOTHER QUALITIES, NOW DEAD

One of England's great cats died on September 28. She was just an ordinary cat minus pedigree papers, rosettes and ribbons. It is doubtful if she ever heard of the famed Crystal Palace and certainly she was never entered in any championship exhibitions.

However, she is probably more widely known than any of the blue-blooded felines of today. Her name was Faith and she lived with her many, many litters at St. Paul's Church in Watling Street.

The famous *London Times* published her obituary, calling her "a London stray." The Associated Press and other news wire services carried stories about her passing and the unusual animal ceremony that followed as she lay at peace. *Time Magazine* followed through with an unusual tribute.

Twelve years ago Faith came to live in the rectory of St. Augustine's. Three times she was turned away by the vergers. But Faith was persistent and on her fourth visit to establish a home, the Rector, Henry Ross, interceded.

"The cat must stay," he said, "She has chosen our church and she must remain."

Faith remained at St. Augustine's, a silent tribute to God from the animal kingdom of this earth. During the services, Faith sat in quiet dignity at the feet of the Rector.

Then on September 6, 1940 at the height of the Nazis' blitz, Faith moved her single kitten at that time from the rectory upstairs to a recess in the basement of the Church. She took up the mothering of the coal-black kitten in a room set aside

for storing music. On the third day after the change of nursery by Faith, bombs burst on the rectory of St. Augustine's.

According to the plaque that appears at the Church today, in honor of Faith, "roofs and masonry exploded. Four floors fell through in front of Faith; fire, water and ruin were all around her. Yet she stayed calm and steadfast and waited for help."

But at the time the firemen who fought the flames after the explosion had given up Faith and her kitten for dead. But Rector Ross was not convinced. He pawed his way over the wreckage and smoldering rubbish and finally made his way to the basement. There in the ruins sat Faith serenely nursing her kitten and "singing" the Rector exclaimed, "such a song of praise and thanksgiving as I had ever heard."

The story of Faith was a story of the "steadfast courage in the Battle of Britain," and in due course Faith was formally recognized by citations from London's People's Dispensary for Sick Animals.

A few years later the well known English writer of cat books, Michael Joseph, sent to Hettie Gray Baker of New York, a magazine story containing a picture of Faith. Miss Baker forwarded a photostat of the article to the Greenwich Village Humane League of New York, and F

was recognized by this great institution with a special citation.

But the honors did not change Faith who continued to be a church cat and sat as always at the Rector's feet when he conducted services.

The black kitten of Faith's is named Panda and now is quartered at the Herne Hill Nursing School in London.

When Faith died, a special service was held at the Holy Trinity Church on the eve of the Feast of St. Francis, the Patron Saint of the animals. Children of the community were invited to attend and bring their pets.

An Associated Press dispatch appeared extensively in the American newspapers and reported the extraordinary occasion for such piety as follows:

"The animals came to church here today, and they sat very solemnly as they heard a Church of England clergyman say there was a very good chance they would go to heaven. They will have to be good of course.

"Children of the community were invited to bring their pets. So, well behaved and decorous, among the worshippers were:

"Dozens of cats and kittens, some pretty with starched ribbons.

"A tiddler in a jar—a tiddler being an English version of a sunfish.

"Ducks, chickens and guinea pigs.

"A lamb with fleece only slightly soiled, accompanied by eight-year-old Mary Hyde.

"Dogs, of course, including a bull mastiff and a tiny Pekinese.

## BLACK MALE PERSIAN WINS IN ITALIAN SHOW

A Black Male Persian, Int. Ch. Pierrot du Bosquet, owned by Mme. Gay of Berne, Switzerland was Best Cat at a show staged at San Pellegrino, Italy on July 25.

The event was staged by the Italian Cat Society and attracted 60 Persians and 31 Siamese. Entries were received from Paris, Geneva, Lusanne, Berne, Zurich as well as from different cities in Italy.

It is expected that the exhibition will result in the reorganization and establishment of exhibitions in Milan and Turin, where outstanding shows were held prior to the War.

## Western Selects Judge

Mrs. E. F. Hamaker of Indianapolis has been selected as the judge of the Western Cat Club show to be held in Los Angeles Jan. 15-16, according to an announcement by Mrs. Zelma V. Philips. The Siamese Cat Society of California and the Silver Fanciers, which will hold supporting specialty events with this all breed show, have not announced judges as yet.

"A white mouse, which made some of the little girls nervous, was brought by six-year-old Philip Parsons.

"The 20 horses, brushed sleek for the occasion, were sized up by the head usher, who came to the doleful decision that they were too big for the pews. So they had to wait outside.

"There were some growls and squeals, but no unseemly incidents. It turned out

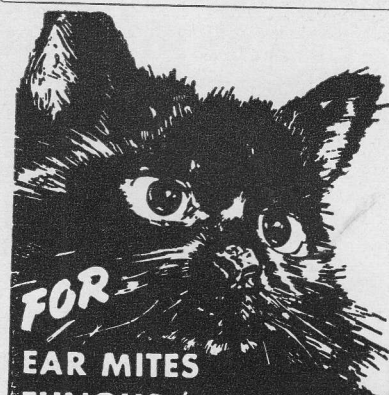
## Mary B. Warfel-Smith

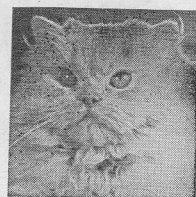

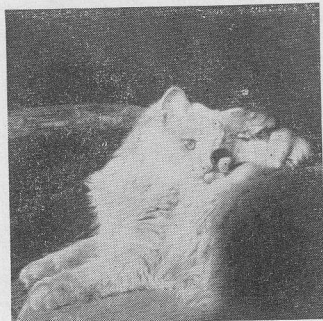

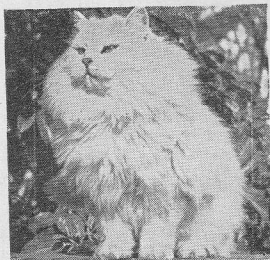

# LOS ANGELES ANIMAL CONTROL LAW BRINGS UNSEEN REPERCUSSIONS

A Los Angeles City Animal Control Ordinance which became effective on July 1, had practically sounded the death-knell of the continued growth of the Cat Fancy in this Pacific Coast Metropolis.

The Ordinance (No. 92876) requires a permit with an annual fee of \$10 for anyone owning four or more cats. The ordinance ties up closely with a zoning regulation which if literally enforced could make it practically impossible for a cat fancier and breeder to harbor more than three cats and to live on his property if he should obtain a cattery license.

The zoning ordinance, effective since June 18, 1946, requires that a cattery must comply with certain building restrictions and must be located only in certain Los Angeles areas. This building code requires fireproof construction of catteries in many of zones permitted. Cat fanciers point out that an initial cost in excess of \$1,000 may be required for the fireproofing alone. Aside from this, they maintain, there are the added fees for zoning, building permits, electricity and plumbing, plus business and cattery licenses and sales taxes.

Cat owners throughout Los Angeles were becoming panicky and many are disposing of their stock because of the law. The wholesale retrenchment of pedigree stock may result in the cancellation of several Pacific Coast exhibitions.

On October 18, Ralph Morris, CATS magazine's Southern California representative and the Los Angeles Chairman of National Cat Week, called a special meeting of cat fanciers representing all clubs in the area regardless of affiliation, to discuss the matter of petitioning for a revision of the Animal Control ordinance.

Among the well known fanciers in attendance were Carolyn Alig, Frances Campbell, Lois Candland, V. E. Dodson, Carrie and Lucy Clingan, Ethel Garson, Jessie Hazlett, Ada Herschberger, Ann and John Konkel, Ann Manley, Jerry MacIntyre, Bess Morse, Ida Reeves, Earl and Zelma Phillips, Alice Smith, Jessie and Harry Stark, Pearl Stettler, Charles Victor, Ina Morris and others. Mr. Morris acted as chairman assisted by Miss Candland as minutes secretary. V. E. Dodson, a practicing attorney, carefully explained the legal interpretations of the ordinances and the possibilities involved if strictly enforced. A committee composed of Mr. Morris, Mr. Philips and Mr. Dodson was chosen to confer with the Animal Control Board. This conference was held October 26 at the City Hall, with a more or less regular result.

The total outcome to date has been an opinion that the existing law is believed to be ill-advised in some of its points; but has other good provisions, although

strict enforcement is neither practical nor desirable in most instances.

While definite legal changes were not brought about, there was a better understanding developed between the law enforcement agencies and members of the cat fancy, plus an assurance that there was no further reason to "see ghosts" or to continue in a panicky state, as enforcement was to be directed at flagrant violators under the intent of the law, rather than to work hardships on the cat fancy itself.

The chief concern of the cat fancy seems to be the element of contagion of such ordinances, other cities following set examples. It was pointed out that cat fanciers in other cities should be alert as to the possibilities of similar ordinances and spring into immediate action if and when these become obnoxious or threatening. It is suggested that cat organizations in other cities where such legislation is contemplated should write to Ralph Morris, 1040 Exposition Blvd., Los Angeles 7, Calif., who may be in a position to offer helpful advice.

A permanent committee has been decided upon in the Los Angeles area to be composed of one member from each local cat club or specialty club, regardless of affiliation, to meet periodically in an effort to carry on a program of education about cats, also to be vigilant in any matters affecting the cat fancy as a whole. A wide-spread radio and newspaper publicity campaign for cat welfare is under way. Arrangements have been made for a lecture series to be held at the field houses of the City Playgrounds, at various clubs and gatherings, to further the public interest in cats, with speakers chosen from the local cat fancy. The hope is that such an educational program may more speedily accomplish what legislation has struggled with so long. It is a long range program, but results should be gratifying. Members of the Animal Control Board and other humane organizations seem to be heartily in accord, as are civic officials. The movement has many ramifications, among which is a possibility of reduction of juvenile delinquency thru helping youngsters to

# THE CHRISTMAS KITTEN

By RITA SWENSON

*"Rather than a dog, I would choose a cat. It has for me the manners essential to social relations. At first, in its early youth, it possesses all the graces, suppleness, unexpectedness by which the most exacting, artistic fancy can be amused! It is adroit, it always knows where it is. Prudent unto caution, it goes everywhere, it examines without soiling, breaking nothing; it is in itself a warmth and a caress; it has not a snout, but a mouth—and what a mouth! It is discreet and of fastidious cleanliness—it cannot be enslaved. It is a dignified, proud, disdainful animal that hides its love affairs in the shadows. It defies advances, tolerates no insults, abandons the house in which it is not treated according to its merits. In short, truly an aristocrat in type and origin."*

These famous words of Alexandre Dumas, quoted and requoted through the years yet never losing flavor, express with an uncanny exactitude sentiments duplicated by cat lovers the world over. Thus, it is not entirely surprising that when the joyous holiday season rolls 'round and thoughts of gift giving fill the air, ones choice for that very especial person ultimately falls upon a kitten. Surely not even the charlatans of old could conjure up a more satisfying expression of love, a more enduring remembrance of The Day. The gift of a kitten, be it Siamese, Manx, or Persian, is a gift without parallel.

However, like most gifts of a highly specialized nature, one should take into consideration the likes and dislikes of the person for whom the gift is intended. Gifts should first of all be appropriate and this is especially true when a kitten is expected to exchange hands. A few discreet inquiries in advance of purchase will make the difference between a delighted recipient and a nonplussed one. Lovely as they are, kittens should never be considered as gifts unless the future owner has the time, means and inclination to accept this claim upon his life.

Then there are those who decide to give THEMSELVES a kitten for Christmas. Some are prompted by a genuine love for cats, others by a cute picture in a magazine, and still others by the thought that a showy cat will enhance the decor of the home. No matter what actually prompts the purchase, if one feels he can accept the cat into his heart and home, attending religiously to its wants, he should develop into a satisfactory master. But never buy a kitten intending to bring it out to be exclaimed over at odd intervals, confining it in a cage the rest of the time.

Never buy a kitten if its little lapses in behavior cannot be forgiven. And never, never buy a kitten expecting to enslave it. Cats are not dog-like either in devotion or mannerisms and simply cannot be whipped into submission. They must be accepted, if at all, for what they are, not for what one hopes to make of them.

Introducing a kitten to a new home requires patience, understanding and a certain amount of fortitude. A kitten that has had brothers and sisters to play with during the day, and sleep with at night, will find a new home without companionship of his own kind a lonesome and bewildering place. During this adjustment period, sympathetic attention to his wants and frequent petting will ease his apprehensions and in the process assure him that the fate that has befallen him isn't so bad after all. A young kitten will adapt itself to a new routine much more readily than an older kitten or young adult, but if one is not accustomed to caring for young kittens, or if there are children in the home, the older kitten is recommended. There is nothing quite so enchanting as a ten weeks old kitten but these are definitely not for the inexperienced or for children.

When bringing a kitten into a new home, do not immediately give him the run of the house. So much strange territory will simply unnerve him. Permit him to run

one room, preferably the kitchen, before permitting him the freedom of other rooms. The kitten may be shy and nervous at first but will soon settle down to an investigation of its new quarters. Only when it is thoroughly familiar with the general plan will it evince an interest in food and drink.

The safest rule to follow in feeding a newly acquired kitten is to adhere strictly to the schedule supplied by the breeder. Sudden changes in diet are responsible for many cases of upset stomach, adding not only to the distress of the kitten, but the owner as well. In cases where no feeding schedule is supplied, one should remember that a kitten is of the carnivorous family, and act accordingly. A meal of finely chopped beef should readily be assimilated for it is the *natural* food for cats.

Add to the beef a pinch of calcium, a few drops of cod liver oil and a fourth teaspoonful of yeast powder—these will help the kitten develop into a strong, heavy boned, healthy tissue specimen. Two good beef meals a day, plus one of evaporated milk diluted one half with water, should prove sufficient. A little Gerber's strained oatmeal may be added to the milk if desired. Food for kittens should always be warmed in advance of serving. After a meal of icy food a kitten will either throw up or suffer stomach and bowel distress.

The matter of the sanitary tray is deserving of attention. Most kittens seem to prefer sand but since this is something of a nuisance in the home, one may prefer to substitute newspaper. However, a kitten that is used to sand will not readily change to paper so one has to introduce the new material gradually. The bottom of the tray should be covered with a piece of folded newspaper and the sand placed on top. Each day a little less sand should be used until it is eliminated entirely. By that time the kitten will accept the paper without question.

One should provide a bed for the new kitten. This should be tucked away in some quiet corner where the kitten will be able to relax with no fear of getting stepped on. At night it is a good policy to either confine the kit in a cage or close all windows in the room. Kittens are notorious for sleeping in drafts or open windows and one has to forestall such action.

Always remember that a kitten brings to the home warmth and companionship that knows no equal. The love he gives his master is not only pleasing but flattering, for the cat does not bestow his attentions promiscuously. He will deeply resent unfair treatment but treat him RIGHT and you have a friend for life.

The book is by the authors of *Know Your Cat*.

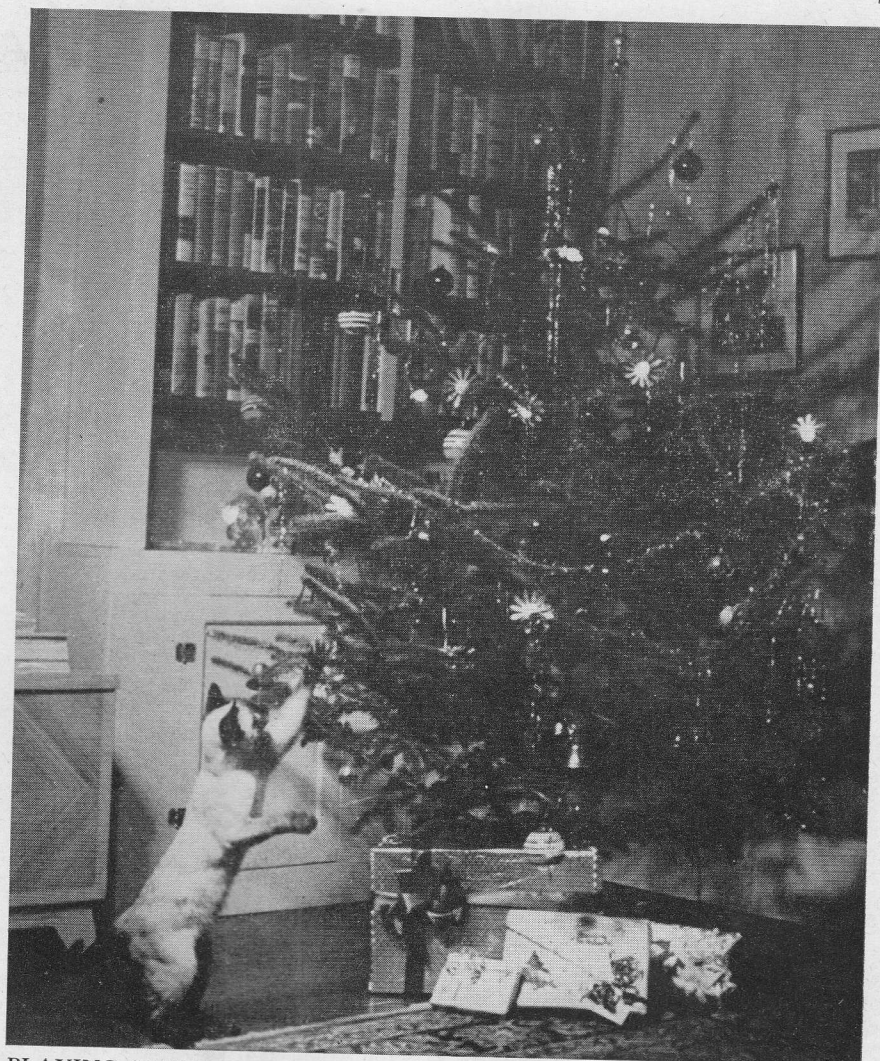

## WHY A CAT FALLS ON ITS FEET

A cat which falls or springs from a height, great or small, generally manages to fall on its feet. This wonderful feat is made possible by the way the muscles of the cat are arranged and the quickness of the cat's instinct for bringing them into play. No matter how a cat is dropped, it is usually able to turn over in the air and so twist itself that its feet come in contact with the ground.

Scientists say that if men could master the secret of the cat, they also would be able to alight on their feet when falling. There is no reason why our muscles should not be as effective as the cat's. Many of us have seen men dive head foremost from a trapeze, turn somersaults in the air, and land safely. Others vault over the backs of horses, whirling around in midair as they go, yet dropping safely on their feet.

The secret seems to be the quick working of the mind; at any rate, scientists tell us that the ordinary man would have power to do as the cat does if he made up his mind quickly enough.

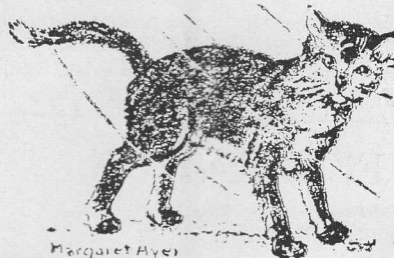
The ability of the cat to alight feet first depends on the healthy condition of its balancing sense, the sense governed by the six little fluid-bearing canals, three in each ear, which enable us to balance ourselves. However, if they played any special part in the wonderful feat of the cat, we should expect to find these balancing canals very highly developed; but they are not. They do not appear to be so perfect in the cat as in man, and neither man nor cat has them so beautifully organized as the bird. We cannot say that there is any particular quality in the cat's balancing sense alone

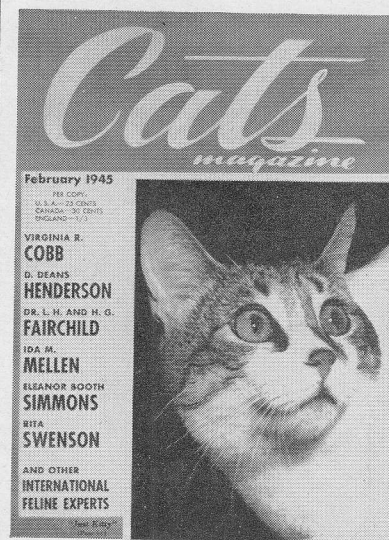

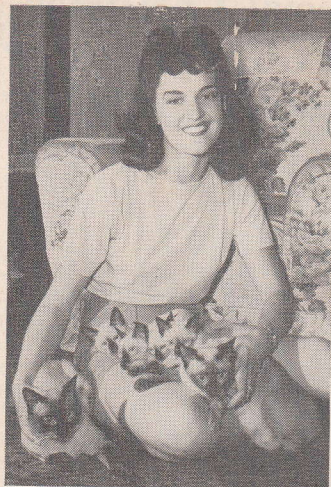
