





## TURKISH CATS FOR THE NOVICE IRIS HANCOX

IN TURKEY, these cats are privately owned in exclusive catteries and are greatly loved and prized. The original five cats imported to Great Britain, nearly seventeen years ago, came from five different districts of Turkey, from totally unrelated lines.

There is no cross-breeding of any kind that can be done with this breed without destroying its unique appearance and character. Coat texture would be completely ruined if mated to any other long-haired or short-haired cat. The Turkish cat's coat hangs straight, long and silky from the roots to the tip. There is no undercoat at all, and so, even a long (four to six inches) coated cat can give the appearance of sleekness. For this reason it has been called a semi long-haired cat. This is incorrect—it simply has no thick or woolly undercoat to give it the bushy or fluffy appearance associated with long-haired cats.

In head, type and markings too, it is like no other long-hair, the head being slightly longer and with a short wedge-shaped muzzle. The ears are comparatively large and set fairly high on the skull. The cheeks are full and the eyes are large, round and expressive—a lovely pale, almost translucent pale amber in colour.

The auburn markings are quite distinctive and appear on the face below the ears, spreading outward and inward over the eyes. The nose, cheeks and lower half of the face are white. The white marking on the face extends upward to form a blaze which divides the auburn markings over the head. The ears are usually white, but sometimes the auburn marking spreads to the ears. This should not be regarded as a serious fault, all other things being good.

The body coat is chalk white, long, fine and silky and the medium length brush is auburn, ringed in a dark and lighter shade. Kittens' tails are more distinctly ringed than cats.

The rims of the eyes, the insides of the feathered ears, the nose leather and the feet pads are a delicate shade of shell pink. The nose is straight.

The body is longish but sturdy—the male being particularly muscular round the shoulders. Although the legs are proportionally strong, the paws are surprisingly neat. Legs are of medium length.

Sometimes, small, irregularly placed auburn patches may be seen on the body and the auburn of the tail may extend a little to the base of the spine. Again, neither of these things should penalise a cat, all other things being of a high standard.

What should be considered serious faults are an incorrect coat, a too round or too long a head and a snub nose.

The standard of points formulated by the Colourpoint Rex-coated and AOV Club, and accepted by the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy, is a standard aimed at perfection, and was not made to fit any particular cat, but was formed from the best points of many cats, bearing in mind that no two cats of any breed ever look exactly alike, however good they are; which makes nonsense of

thinking anyone can judge efficiently from just a standard of points.

When buying a kitten, all the rules apply; as stated so many times in FUR AND FEATHER, bright eyes, clean ears and bottoms, firm little bodies. The breeder will have a diet chart for the buyer—diet will be very little different from that of other kittens—the exception, perhaps, being fish; this doesn't seem a popular food. Water only—and always available—after early kittenhood to drink—never milk.

The grooming of Turkish cats is different from that of other breeds. From an early age they love water and can be bathed in a warm room in water at the cat's body temperature. Use a baby or lanolin soap, never a detergent shampoo.

The kittens are dried gently, not rubbed, with warm towels and then penned. If possible, in a warm room until quite dry. A gentle combing is all that is

necessary afterwards. Brushing and talcum powdering make the coat static, giving a weird 'fly away' appearance.

The breeder will also have for the buyer, a registered pedigree and there should be no other breed on the pedigree—breed 13D. If there is, I hope anyone receiving such a pedigree will contact me at Flat 4, 22 Villa Road, Nottingham, as club secretary at once. There will also be a transfer form for the new owner to transfer the kitten to her ownership. This must be filled in correctly and signed by the breeder, and then sent to the GCCF Registrar for Long-haired cats. Her address is on the transfer form.

Make quite sure the kitten has been inoculated against Feline Infectious Enteritis. The breeder will have a certificate to this effect for each kitten—the certificate showing the date or dates of either one or two inoculations, depending on the type used.



## READERS' VIEWS ON SHOW MANAGEMENT

I AGREE with Mrs Bishop's remarks about the running of shows. Now that they are larger and more frequent new ways of improving the management of them must be found.

At a recent show managers' meeting some good suggestions were put forward for consideration and it is to be hoped that some of the procedures agreed upon at the meeting will be accepted by people who attend shows but do not run them.

It may be difficult for some committee members to get to the show manager's house but there are several things they can do such as addressing the envelopes for the schedules and sending them out, helping to get the veterinary surgeon's cards and tallies out, trying to give help with the judges' books, if only to help with checking (these have to be done when other things are finished, it is the last chore and a most important one, they should always be finished ready to take to the hall on the day before the show).

Many things crop up at the last minute; judges are sometimes taken ill and have to be substituted at the last minute. This may mean a great deal of alteration to existing plans. Catering arrangements may be upset or a dozen other things. At least six helpers should be on hand at the hall the day before the show.

In spite of all the thought given to arrangements there are always cats put in wrong pens, do not have correct tallies on, owners turn up minus tallies and elastic to say nothing of blankets and trays. Putting all these things to rights causes delay and irritation, but if we have a sense of humour we get by.

My remarks mostly concern the bigger shows. No one should attempt to run a show of over 400 exhibits single handed. If committee members are not prepared to help, adequate paid assistance should be given to the show manager.

Don't forget the clearing up after the show, the marking of about forty catalogues which have to be sent to the secretaries of clubs supporting the show, all the invoices and cheques to write for the prize money after it has been worked out, envelopes to address and a balance sheet to prepare.

From the time of typing out the schedules to sending out the prize money one must allow at least five months.

The ideal set-up is, of course, a husband-and-wife team though if the show is very big outside help may have to be recruited.

I must say here that there is a lot to be said in favour of the procedure followed by the Continental and overseas shows of presenting all the prizes at the end of the show. But, of course, this would mean two-day events which so far are not practicable in this country.

I take this opportunity of asking my fellow show managers to support me in calling a halt to the taking of flash-light photographs while cats are being passed along the table for best in show judging. I have observed the cats' reactions closely and while it is true to say that some cats do not mind, others will suddenly become agitated when a flash hits them full in the face, the resultant struggle which takes place between anxious judges and helpers will often upset one or more of the other cats.

These photographs are not taken officially and if owners wish to have their cats photographed at the show, this can be done by their own arrangement in the hall when judging is finished or when the best cats are safely in their pens.

Several good cats have lost their chance of winning best because they suddenly get upset. It is usually the short-haired which are affected as they have to be handled at the very end of a long day. E TOWE, Hove, Sussex.

I WHOLEHEARTEDLY agree with Mrs Bishop (September 11) that show managers deserve and should be paid an adequate fee for the arduous and often thankless task of running present day mammoth cat shows. I do not agree that clubs look upon cat shows as profit-making events. If they do, they must be sadly disappointed more often than not. Checking back on various show balance sheets for the past five years it is clear that a reasonable rate for the job cannot be paid out of profits. In most cases the net profit was less than £30 and in some the show was run at an actual loss. To take Herts and Middlesex as an example.

The 1968 show account shows cash receipts of £1,779. After prize money and all expenses including the show manager's honorarium had been paid, there was a net balance of £28. But, had it not been for an amount of £30 raised on a raffle and tombola there would have been a small loss on what was apparently a most successful show and a very good gate. The success or failure of a show from a cash point of view is determined not by the entry and penning fees paid by exhibitors, which never cover costs, but by the size of the gate, and that is something which cannot be foreseen or guaranteed.

It is obvious that hypothetical profits based on such a variable factor as the size of the gate cannot be used to guarantee an adequate fee for the show manager, and I would suggest that in view of the greatly increased costs of all commodities and services now prevailing, more realistic penning and entry fees should be charged, and a per capita sum be levied on each entry, this money to be used to guarantee a reasonable basic fee for the show manager and any extra assistance required should the show be of such size as to render this necessary.

Even if these suggestions were put into effect, it is unlikely that any club would be able to pay current commercial rates for the job and we would still have to rely on the dedicated few willing to work for the love of the job rather than financial reward.

I fully realise that any suggestion of increased charges to exhibitors will bring a storm of protest about my head, but the unpalatable fact is that charges to exhibitors have not kept pace with increased costs and each exhibitor has now to be subsidised from another source.

Were cat shows to be run as profit-making commercial undertakings, the cost to exhibitors would be prohibitive. As it is, club officials, judges, stewards and a tiny band of dedicated helpers give long hours of often unrewarding service without any thought of financial recompense. Without them and their unpaid work, shows simply could not be held. Vitally necessary as these people are, however, the full burden of organising and planning, and the sheer grind of endless hours of drudgery rests upon the shoulders of the show manager, and it is right and proper that a suitable financial token of appreciation should be given. This might take the form of a basic minimum sum guaranteed according to the number of entries and financed by levy, plus a percentage of the profit—if any—resulting from various money-raising activities and the gate. ### TWO COLOURED CATS ARE BICOLOURS

I am quite convinced that the registration of breeds 13a and 26a is far too easy. I am most surprised to find black and white and red and white cats being exhibited in these classes. To me they are Bicolours with wrong markings and I, with generations of good pedigree, would not consider registering them any other numbers. To my way of thinking, when they have no pedigree it is even worse. I can think of no reason why any of these cats should not be registered as Bicolour and thus be able to enter in these classes and take their chances—it is quite wrong that they are labelled AOV.

I am quite sure the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy was right to stop non-pedigree cats entering for ch certificates. I would even go so far as to stop non-pedigree cats entering at all—only as household pets. The cat world has grown so that it is not good to encourage this practice and it would help would-be fanciers to start in the correct way.

To me there should be a date given in the future such as 1970 that no non pedigree cats are eligible to compete in classes other than in household pet classes.

It would also put AOV on a surer basis of pedigree stock.

Again, if the Bicolour standard was altered to the given suggestion I have mentioned above, there would be no choice. Two coloured cats are Bicolours, wrongly or correctly marked. N WOODFIELD


