

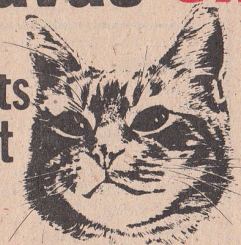

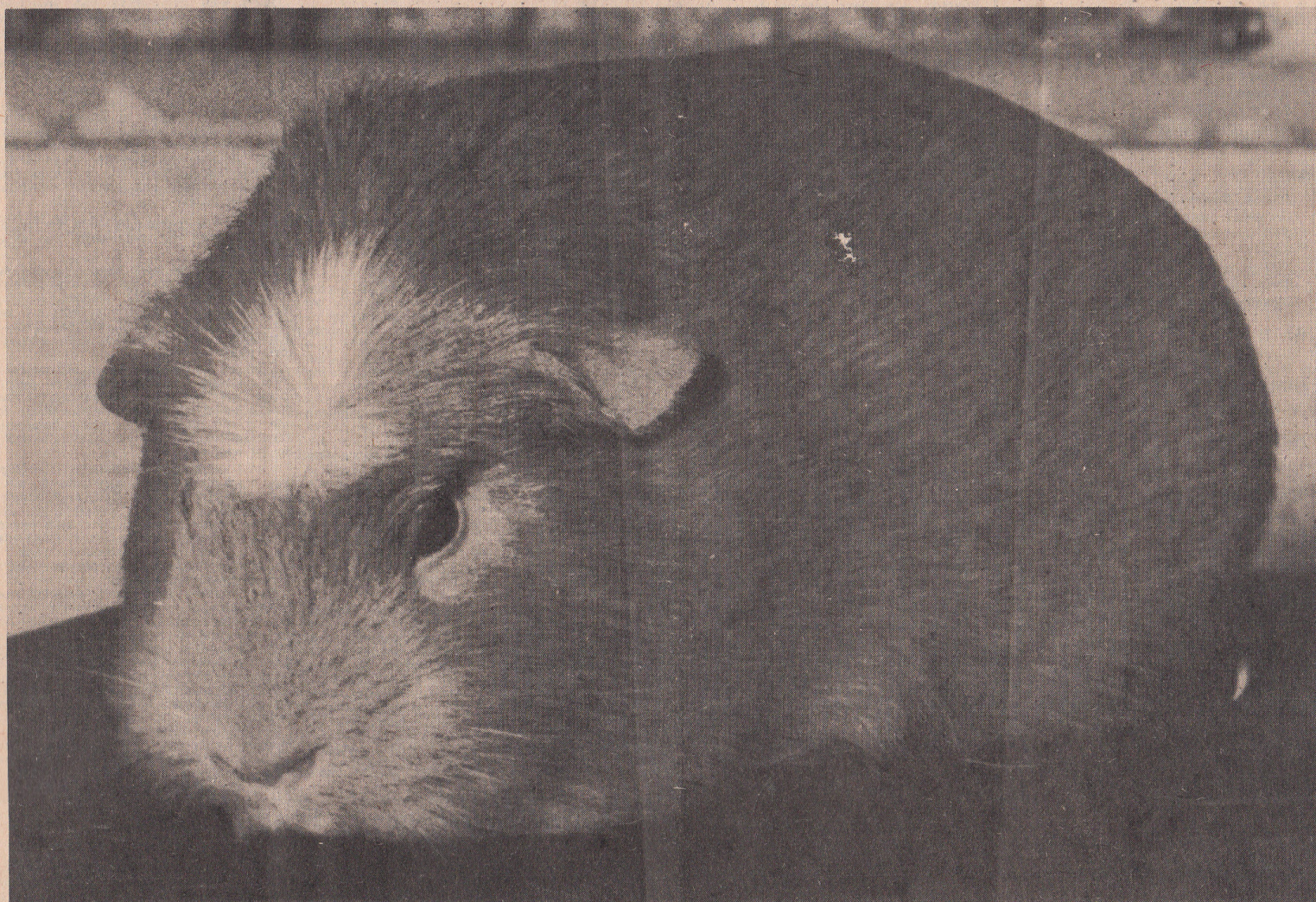

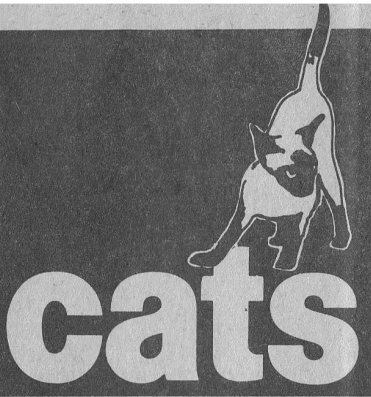

### Willing to pay more

HAVING READ the letter written by A Buckley 'What are you prepared to afford' FUR & FEATHER, March 2, I was most surprised to hear that there actually are people, who think that thirty pence, is too expensive for a copy of FUR & FEATHER. So I had to take out my typewriter to give you my thoughts.

As far as I understand the economics of it the thirty pence payable for the weekly issue covers:

1. Printing the paper and all the production costs.
2. Sending it out to the postal subscribers at the first-class postage rates of nine pence (which reduces the actual cost of FUR & FEATHER already to twenty-one pence).
3. For veterinary advice (which is free of

charge and if some of the 'cost-complainers' would visit the veterinary surgeon to get this same advice they would obviously have to pay more).

4. Good entertainment in having the show reports (which they otherwise would not get at all).

In this respect thirty pence is a little amount if not too little. After all you do not have to be rich to be able to afford FUR & FEATHER as you would have to be to afford for example a German-printed magazine about cats which costs ninety-five pence per month and only one edition.

I am happy to be able to get FUR & FEATHER at all and am quite prepared to pay even more just to get it. G G STYR

I WISH to make a very strong protest about the remarks of Mr Winder (re the Scottish Cat Club show) on my Bonnymuir Erling. He also criticised my Bonnymuir Melantha.

Had he confined his remarks to Melantha, I would not have troubled to write. I know from experience how judges can differ and as Melantha had won a challenge certificate at Dundee a fortnight before (which it is amusing to note is reported on the very same page of FUR & FEATHER as Mr Winder's strictures) I am not unduly worried. He is entitled to his opinion.

He is not, however, entitled to comment on Erling, who was NOT AT THE SHOW! I entered him but did not take him! Never before have I known of cats being disqualified in their absence!

I am particularly annoyed because Erling has entered only two shows in both of which against stiff opposition, he gained Premier certificates. Also he has been first in every class he has entered—some of them very large classes—except one, in which he was placed second.

Before embarking on such criticism a judge should surely check the name of the cat with the same care and attention to detail which he is urging on breeders? MAY JENKINS

### Cameos prior to 1971

I SHOULD like to enlarge upon Mrs Croysdill's article about the LH Cameo in FUR & FEATHER March 9, which I feel may be rather misleading. Contrary to her belief Cameos were, indeed, being bred with a view to recognition prior to 1971. Mesdames Ellis and Britton did a great deal of research into the subject and closely followed pedigrees of American Cameos and Shaded Silver LH cats.

Mymwood Dymples, female Shaded Silver, dam Widdington Honey Bee (5), sire Ch Dulcimo Jonathan (10), was born November 20, 1968.

Barrose Honey Bear, Shaded Cameo male (see Champion cats of the World Illust 35), dam Widdington Painted Lady (11), sire Ch Dulcimo Jonathan (10), was born June 10, 1969.

Unfortunately these two ladies had to stop breeding for a time and my parents Mr and Mrs Bickley, were lucky enough to obtain the two cats.

The pair were mated and their first litter was born in 1971 consisting of two female Shaded Silvers, one male Shaded Cameo and one female Shell Cameo.

We kept the female Cameo and put her back to Honey Bear. She bore litters of the three shades of true Cameo. However, Chinchilla type was prominent and so an outcross was made with a Cream queen. Better-type Cameos resulted, the most well known being Holdenhurst Bonita which went to Mrs P Judge and who very successfully bred Cameos in the early 1970's. Mrs Croysdill had her first Cameo from a repeat of this mating (Holdenhurst Veronique).

Unfortunately in using the Cream outcross, the lovely pure white undercoat was lost. We experimented and used a White queen with Honey Bear. The results were solid whites and cameos of perfect type, undercoat and ticking! We were, of course, careful in our choice of White. She had no ancestors (that we could trace) with the spotted gene, ie Bicolour or Tortie and White.

We kept a White female from this mating and bred her with a Cameo stud. The resultant Cameos are mostly Red Smokes, male and female, this proving that she passes on the 110 (Cameo) gene.

Other breeders have been experimenting with the Cameo, using a Smoke instead of Chinchilla to obtain the first generation. This cat seems to have a better type, but loses the very delicate ticking found in the Chinchilla line. It also produces the lovely part-colour females.

There are enough Cameos from both lines to make further outcrossings unnecessary. I have found after eight years of experimenting that the best results are obtained from a cross-mating between a cat from the Chinchilla line and a cat from the Smoke line. Such a litter can be expected to contain each shade of Cameo and retain the Persian type.

I should be interested to hear from any reader who still has one of the dozens of Holdenhurst Cameos bred from 1971 to 1975 and which were mainly sold as pets. SUE BUTLER
